Applications Now Open for Scholarship to ICP's Documentary Practice and Visual Journalism Program

NEW YORK, NY (MARCH 7, 2018) The International Center of Photography (ICP), the world's leading institution dedicated to photography and visual culture, today announced the launch of the Reuters Scholarship for Visual Journalism—one full-tuition scholarship over the next three years now available to full-time students in ICP's One-Year Certificate program in Documentary Practice and Visual Journalism. As part of the program, the scholarship recipient will also receive support from and portfolio reviews with Reuters journalists.

This marks the latest collaboration between Reuters and the International Center of Photography. In addition to the inclusion of several images by Reuters photographers in the ICP archives, the two organizations co-hosted 2016's [Iconic in an Instant? One Trillion Images](#) event. The all-day gathering brought together Pulitzer Prize-winning photojournalists, photo editors, and leaders in media to discuss critical issues in photojournalism today.
