ICP's Teen Academy program creates spaces for students to locate themselves in the traditions and teachings of imagemaking. The program is designed to cultivate visual literacy, personal vision, and leadership skills through classes focused on the techniques and history of photography and visual culture.

Courses include black-and-white and color darkroom instruction, digital intensives, and a yearlong advanced program called Imagemakers. All curricula is youth-centered and includes: photographic and writing assignments, lab time, visual presentations, discussions, critiques, a field trip, a guest artist visit, and a culminating presentation for family and friends celebrating the students' achievements.

Teen Academy is committed to making photography education accessible to all young people regardless of their economic resources. Need-based scholarships are available before the start of each term.
