FORM I-20 INSTRUCTIONS and APPLICATION

The follow instructions carefully explain how to get your *Form I-20*. *Form I-20* Application materials must be submitted <u>completely</u> to avoid delays in receiving your *Form I-20*.

- Creative Practice (CP)
- Documentary Practice & Visual Journalism (DOC)
- New Media Narratives (NMN)
- ICP-Bard Master of Fine Arts (MFA)

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Form I-20 Information

A. <u>VISA DON'TS- NOW THAT YOU ARE PLANNING TO BE A STUDENT THERE ARE TWO THINGS YOU</u> <u>CAN'T DO!</u>

1. DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. WITH A B-1, B-2, OR B-1/2 VISA

If you use a B visa to enter the U.S. you are saying "I'm here as a visitor" only. Since you contacted our school about study, this could be viewed as misrepresenting your purpose for entering the U.S. and you might be refused permission to extend or change your status. Do not listen to people who say it is easy to enter the country as a visitor and change your status to F-1 Student. It is not true! U.S. federal regulations prohibit B Visitors from pursuing a course of study prior to obtaining a change of status to F-1 Student.

If your study plans are not certain and you want to enter the U.S. to visit schools, you must explain this on your visa application and ask the visa officer for a B-2 visa with the words "Prospective student" noted on it or have the words added to your B visa if you already have one.

2. DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. on the Visa Waiver Program (WT or WB)

If you are from a country from which you can enter the U.S. as a visitor by registering for ESTA, do not do this. You will be permitted to stay for only 90 days. You will not be given more time or allowed to change to F-1 Student status.

DOES EVERYONE NEED A FORM I-20?

No. If you are maintaining another nonimmigrant status in the U.S., you do not have to have an I-20 and may attend school full- or part-time. Dependent children in E, H, I, J, L, M, N, O, P, R, or S status need to change status after their 21st birthday or if they marry. If you have no legal status, you may attend school but you are not eligible to change status and do not need an I-20.

B. <u>Definition of a Form I-20</u>

The *Form I-20* is the Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status – For Academic or Language Students for the purposes of attending one of ICP's full-time programs.

A *Form I-20* tells the U.S. government that you are eligible for F-1 Student Status. It certifies that 1) you meet our admissions requirements; 2) you will pursue a full course of study; <u>and</u> 3) you provided evidence to ICP supporting that you have enough money to study and live in the U.S. without working illegally or suffering from poverty.

You must have a *Form I-20* in order to obtain an F-1 student visa/status, to travel, and to keep lawful F-1 status when transferring or changing schools within the U.S.

Your *Form I-20* cannot be issued until you are accepted into our school <u>unconditionally</u> which includes meeting the English language requirement <u>and</u> prove that you have enough finances for your program of study.

Please note: <u>The U.S. government law requires that ICP ensures that you will have enough financial</u> <u>support during your stay before ICP issues your *Form I20*. The guidelines that ICP follows are based upon government regulations and policies.</u>

- C. The Criteria for Receiving a Form I-20
 - 1. YOU MUST BE ACCEPTED INTO ONE OF ICP'S FULL-TIME PROGRAMS.
 - 2. YOU MUST <u>PROVE</u> TO US THAT YOU CAN SUPPORT THE COSTS OF LIVING AND STUDYING IN THE U.S. FOR <u>EVERY YEAR</u> OF YOUR PROGRAM OF STUDY.
 - a. YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO WORK IN THE U.S. TO HELP MEET YOUR ANNUAL COSTS! On-campus employment is limited; off-campus employment is rarely granted.
 - b. SOMETIMES, WE MAY HAVE TO ASK YOU TO GIVE US MORE PROOF OF YOUR FUNDING or EMPLOYMENT perhaps more than once.
 - 3. YOU MUST FOLLOW ICP'S *ESTIMATED* ANNUAL COSTS.

THIS IS THE AMOUNT THAT YOU MUST PROVE THAT YOU CAN SUPPORT FOR EVERY YEAR IN YOUR PROGRAM OF STUDY. (The Certificate Programs are one year long; the ICP-Bard MFA Program is two years long.)

- a. THESE ANNUAL COST AMOUNTS ARE <u>NOT NEGOTIABLE</u>. They represent <u>a</u> <u>conservative budget</u>. We strongly recommend that you budget at least 10-20% more if possible for any 'extras' (i.e. cell phone, subway fare etc.).
- b. Students and their families should look closely at the costs of living and studying (particularly in NYC) and make careful plans.
- c. EXPECT ANNUAL INCREASES in tuition and living costs of approximately 10%.

D. <u>The Process of Applying for your *Form I-20*.</u>

- 1. COMPLETE Page 7, APPLICATION FOR A *FORM I-20*, and PAGE 8, STUDENT STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT.
- 2. HAVE YOUR SPONSOR(S) COMPLETE THE SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT (page 9) AND INCLUDE ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS.
- 3. YOU MUST SUBMIT
 - □ Page 7, APPLICATION FOR A *FORM I-20*, and PAGE 8, STUDENT STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT
 - A copy of your Passport ID page (and any U.S. Visas if you have them)
 - The complete proof of funding and employment documentation for yourself and each sponsor
 - You may also be required to submit additional documentation if you are a transfer-in student current on an F-1 student visa (see page 14) or have F-2 dependents (see page 13)
- 4. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION FOR A *FORM I-20*, SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTS via <u>www.dropbox.com</u>.
 - You will need to create an account.
 - You do not need to install Dropbox on your computer and you can use the web uploader.
 - Put all of the documents into one folder titled with <u>YOUR NAME</u> (as it appears on your passport) and <u>share with ssandoval@icp.edu</u>. If the folder is not titled properly we may be unable to process your *Form I-20* Application.

DO NOT SEND US ORIGINALS.

KEEP THE ORIGINALS TO TAKE TO YOUR VISA INTERVIEW. WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU COMPILE YOUR *FORM I-20* APPLICATION AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AFTER YOUR ACADEMIC APPLICATION ACCEPTANCE TO AVOID DELAYS IN GETTING YOUR *FORM I-20*.

E. <u>Funding Sources:</u> YOUR FUNDING CAN COME FROM ANY COMBINATION OF SOURCES IN THE U.S. OR ABROAD:

- 1. <u>PERSONAL FUNDS</u> come from <u>your own</u> resources, not those of anyone else. If your parents put money in your bank account, they are considered your cash sponsors and must provide all the evidence required. Unless you have enough cash to support yourself for your entire program of study or can prove other sources of personal income, you will need a sponsor with an income and resources sufficient to support you.
- 2. <u>FUNDS FROM "SPONSORS</u>" (parents, relatives, friends, organizations). You may have as many sponsors as you need.
- **3.** FUNDS FROM A HOUSING SPONSOR THAT OFFERS FREE ROOM AND BOARD. Free room and board is when you live with someone and don't have to pay for your room or food.
- 4. FUNDS FROM A SCHOLARSHIP, GRANT, LOAN, ASSISTANTSHIP and FELLOWSHIP.

F. <u>Supporting Documents Required for Funding Sources:</u> ALL DOCUMENTS YOU GIVE US MUST BE:

- 1. Less than two months old.
- 2. In English. (Please have documents translated if not in English)

Please note: <u>LETTERS FROM BANK OFFICIALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND WE CANNOT ACCEPT</u> BANK STATEMENTS THAT DO NOT SPECIFY MONTHLY BALANCES AND DEPOSITS!

PERSONAL FUNDS (If you plan to support yourself):

- 1. BANK STATEMENTS from each account for the last six months. <u>These should be a monthly</u> <u>detailed statement of balances including withdrawals and deposits for each account.</u>
- 2. PROOF OF INCOME.

At least TWO of the following:

- Income tax returns or receipts
- Pay stubs for last six months
- Letter from employer on company letterhead stating salary and length of employment

SPONSORS OF CASH SUPPORT:

- 1. SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT OF ANNUAL CASH SUPPORT. All questions must be answered.
- 2. BANK STATEMENTS from each account for the last six months. <u>These should be a monthly</u> <u>detailed statement of balances including withdrawals and deposits for each account.</u>

3. PROOF OF INCOME.

At least TWO of the following:

- □ Income tax returns or receipts
- Pay stubs for last six months
- Letter from employer on company letterhead stating salary and length of employment

COMPANY SPONSOR

• Must submit business registration and licenses along with the required evidence listed in items 1-3 under Sponsors of Cash Support.

HOUSING SPONSORS OF FREE ROOM AND BOARD:

- 1. SPONSOR'S AFFIDAVIT OF FREE ROOM AND BOARD
- 2. BANK STATEMENTS from each account for the last six months. <u>These should be a monthly</u> <u>detailed statement of balances including withdrawals and deposits for each account.</u>

3. PROOF OF INCOME. At least TWO of the following:

- Income tax returns or receipts
- Pay stubs for last six months
- Letter from employer on company letterhead stating salary and length of employment
- 4. COPY OF LEASE OR DEED

SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANT FUNDS AND LOANS:

COPY OF YOUR AWARD LETTER OR CONTRACT stating the monetary amount of the award.

G. <u>Warnings</u>

- 1. It is highly recommended that **at least part of your financial support come from your home country**. This helps when you interview for your student visa!
- 2. A sponsor should promise only as much money as he or she is <u>capable</u> of giving you. Some sponsors believe that the more money they promise the easier it will be to get your I-20. THE MOST COMMON REASON FOR REJECTION OF FINANCIAL DOCUMENTS IS THAT WE DO NOT BELIEVE THE SPONSOR CAN AFFORD TO GIVE AS MUCH MONEY AS PROMISED. A sponsor should promise only what they intend to give and only as much as can be afforded.
- 3. The income of a company *is not* the personal income of the owner of the business and will not be accepted as proof of income. The owner/sponsor must still provide all the required evidence of a CASH SPONSOR including proof of personal income.
- 4. If a bank statement is in the name of more than one person, each individual listed must submit an affidavit of support.
- 5. We cannot accept bank statements that do not specify monthly balances, withdrawals and deposits. Letters from banks are not acceptable as proof of finances.

E. Housing Sponsor Instructions

By completing the housing sponsor affidavit, you are swearing to the U.S. government that you are providing free room and board. This means that this student will live with you free of any charge for room and food *for every year* he or she is attending the International Center of Photography. 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H. Transfer-In F-1 Student Instructions

Please note that as a Transfer-In F-1 student you must:

- Be currently attending another institution and maintain F-1 student status, or
- Be currently on Post-Completion Optional Practical Training (OPT), or
- Be within your 60 day grace period and still remain in the U.S.

Federal regulations require that you meet the following criteria before your Student Exchange and Visitor Information System (SEVIS) record can be transferred on SEVIS and your I-20 produced:

- 1) You meet our admissions requirements so <u>you must first be accepted into one of the</u> <u>Full-Time Programs</u>.
- 2) Submit your I-20 Application for review: You must provide evidence to ICP supporting that you have enough money to study and live in the U.S. without working illegally or suffering from poverty. This means you must successfully complete this *Form I-20* Application including all of the supporting documentation before your *Transfer-In form* will be sent to you. Do not request a record transfer from your current school before your form has been provided to you.
- 3) You must also submit a copy of every *Form I-20* for each program you have attended while an F-1 student along with your I-20 Application and supporting documentation.
- 4) *Employment Authorization Document EAD Card*(s) if you have been or are engaged in Optional Practical Training (OPT).
- 5) Once you have successfully completed your *Form I-20* application, then you will be sent a Transfer-In form. You must submit this Transfer-In form to your current institution's DSO

You should be aware that your SEVIS record must be transferred to ICP before you depart the U.S. while on your 60 day Grace Period otherwise you will need to enter on a new SEVIS ID and will be required to obtain a new student visa before you re-enter the U.S.
