INAUGURAL REUTERS SCHOLARSHIP FOR VISUAL JOURNALISM AWARDED TO NORWEGIAN STUDENT NORA SAVOSNICK

Photographer chosen for her work making images that address agency, authorship, and identity

NEW YORK, NY (JULY 16, 2018) — The International Center of Photography (ICP), the world's leading institution dedicated to photography and visual culture, today announced photographer Nora Savosnick as the first recipient of the Reuters Scholarship for Visual Journalism, one of three full-tuition scholarships available to students in ICP's full-time One-Year Certificate program in Documentary Practice and Visual Journalism. In addition to attending the ICP School for free during the 2018–2019 academic year, Savosnick will have access to support from and portfolio reviews with Reuters journalists. The Reuters Scholarship will also be awarded for the 2019–2020 and 2020–2021 academic years.

Savosnick previously studied at the Oslo Photo Art School, the Bilder Nordic School of Photography, and Agder Folkehøgskole. Her most recent work is a series about people who dare to expose their true identities to the world.

"The ICP School sought out highly motivated students from diverse backgrounds who have interesting stories to tell, a strong visual sense, a curiosity about using media in different and innovative ways, and who want to make a difference in the world," says Karen Marshall, chair of the Documentary Practice and Visual Journalism program. "We're thrilled to support Nora, whose work examines identity and culture."

"Reuters is committed to supporting the development of budding journalists who represent the future generation of imagemakers and storytellers," said Reuters Global Editor of Video and Pictures John Pullman. "This new program with ICP will allow Reuters to share the wealth of skills and experience our photojournalists have gained working in the field, adding to the stellar academic program that ICP offers."

"I'm honored to be selected as the first recipient of the Reuters Scholarship for Visual Journalism," says Savosnick. "The support from ICP and Reuters will be invaluable as I continue my work in photographing non-conforming societies and challenging viewers to reflect in new ways, and gain insight not only into other people's lives, but also my own. I hope my photos ultimately inspire others to have the courage to reveal themselves."
