He is the co-author of *Uniform: Order and Disorder* (also an exhibition at P.S. 1/MoMA), and *Total Living, Excess: Mainstream and Underground in the '80s*, which was also an exhibition at the Pitti Palace in Florence. Under his leadership, *T: The New York Times Style Magazine* expanded internationally and won "Magazine of the Year" from the Society of Publication Designers.
