International Center of Photography Presents Teen Academy Imagemakers Exhibition Sponsored by ING Financial Services; features photography by high school juniors and seniors

New York, NY (May 9, 2011) - The International Center of Photography (ICP) will present an exhibition of its Teen Academy Imagemakers students from May 27 through June 5, 2011, in its Rita K. Hillman Education Gallery (1114 Avenue of the Americas, New York, NY). An opening reception, sponsored by ING Financial Services, will be held on June 1 from 6 to 8 p.m.

ICP's Teen Academy programs offer a range of opportunities for teenagers to develop their knowledge of photography. Courses range from 10-week classes in black-and-white and color instruction to the yearlong intensive Imagemakers program focusing on professional applications.

Teen Academy Imagemakers enables 36 motivated high school juniors and seniors to advance their photography skills and develop an awareness of the creative and professional possibilities in the photography field. The weekly program provides students with guidance from some of New York's best teaching artists; field trips to museums, galleries, and studios; college-prep workshops; pre-professional assignments; mentorship opportunities in the field; and full access to ICP's facilities.

The curriculum is designed to cover a more in-depth study of photography including: self-portraiture, documentary study, photojournalism, personal vision, fashion, and studio work. At the completion of the program, students have created an extensive portfolio, including an artist's statement and résumé, and are honored in this gallery exhibition.

"All aspects of the Imagemakers curriculum are intended to encourage and inspire the students to further express and strengthen their artistic voices. Our college prep workshops further support their readiness for higher education. Last year, 100 percent of our Imagemakers graduates enrolled in college," said Willis E.
